- 1. Recite the Ten Commandments (short form)
- 2. Recite the Lord's Prayer (word for word)
- 3. Brief exam on the *Children's Catechism* (*First Catechism* from GPC at http://www.opc.org/cce/FirstCatechism.html) or the *Westminster Shorter Catechism* (for older children)
- 4. Examination of his understanding of his sin and the work of Jesus (why the cross?)
- 5. Examination of his understanding of the Scriptural command to examine himself (1 Cor. 11:28)
